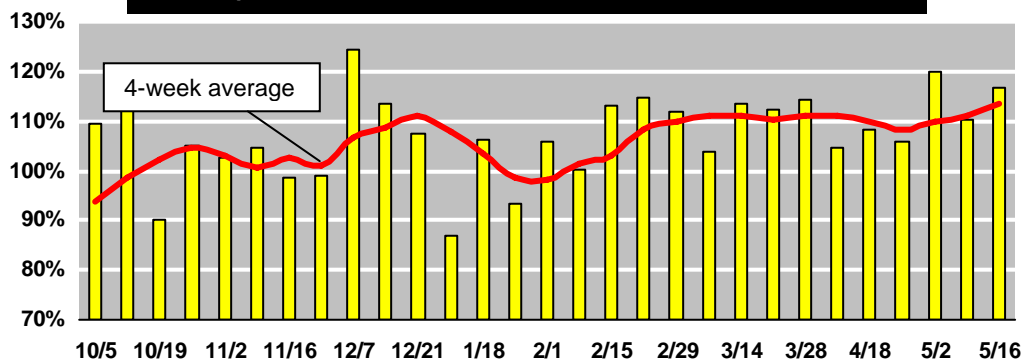

Pershing Elementary School's *Weekly Service Index* closed at the 116.9 level on Friday. This means that as a group, the school's short-run service indicators managed to reach approximately 117% of their goals.

FIVE DAYS

In terms of actual results vs. goal: 1) ten of 16 weekly indicators improved this week; 2) three fell back; and 3) three were unchanged. The indicator that improved by the greatest amount this week was the *4th grade Reading Counts participation*. The participation rate improved from 34% to 49% in only five days (goal = 50%). The Pershing indicator that slipped by the greatest amount vs. goal was the *best practices-to-classroom walk-throughs measurement*. While above goal, it did drop off to 100% from 120% in the prior week.

What should make Principal Cupid-McCoy most proud this week is that every single one of Pershing's 16 weekly indicators finished at 85% of goal or better. This is why the indexes all appear in either yellow or blue within the table on the next page. (Please see the indexes for this week in the table.) These colors indicate performance at the 85% level or greater. This is also the second time this level of success has occurred in the past three weeks...an impressive fact given the late point in the 2007-08 school year.

How to read the table: The indexes are read as percent-of-goal achieved whereby 100.0 equals exact-to-goal. Dr. Cupid-McCoy established these weekly measures last summer as method for tracking progress against the school's strategic goals during the year. If any indicator has its index shaded in red, then it is performing at less than 85% of goal for that time period. Over time, Pershing's five-day service indicators should be falling inside the 85.0 to 110.0 range (these are shaded in yellow).
